Select and Choose  
Trees that are Zone  
Hardy for Where you  
Plan to Plant

Avoid Planting Tree Species  
that Produce Slip Hazards  
(i.e. Fruits and Nuts)  
Close to Sidewalks, Parking  
Lots, and Driveways

Don't Plant Trees Near  
Underground Pipes (like Sewer  
Lines or Drains) or by Overhead  
Wires. Call the Ohio Utilities  
Protection Service (OUPS) before  
you dig at 811!

### November Tree Planting Tips

November is an ideal month to plant trees in Ohio due to these favorable conditions:

- Warm soils
- Low transplant stress
- Trees require less water in November than during the heat of the summer
- Trees will grow roots with adequate moisture in November
- Trees are easier to plant due to cooler temperatures

Don't Plant Large Trees  
Near or Under Utility Lines.  
Place Trees where they  
have Plenty of Room to  
Grow to Avoid Excessive  
Pruning.

Choose Trees that are  
Tolerant of Light Conditions  
that Exist.  
Is the Site Full Sun or Shade?

Perform Soil Testing Prior to  
Planting. Plant Species Tolerant  
of the Site's Existing Soil pH.  
Consult with an Ohio ISA  
Certified Arborist regarding the  
best tree species for your area  
and the best methods of  
installation.
